3	<p>Reports from Parish Council –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Play area – proposals for new equipment ○ Footpaths ○ Queens Platinum Jubilee ○ Community Orchard ○ Community Speed Watch ○ Cornwall Community Land Trust – affordable housing. <p>The Chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting and invited everyone to have a look at the information displayed around the hall. Discussions on individual projects could be held with Councillors and this would be followed by a question and answer session, at the end.</p>	
4	Reports from other organisations. None.	
5	<p>Questions from parishioners and public. At the start of this session Cllr D Hicks read his Chairmans report covering the work and achievements of the parish council over the past year. He also welcomed new Councillors Harriet Curtis, Carol Samuel, Peter Tunnicliffe and Geoff Hardman.</p> <p>Questions were presented to the parish council on the following topics:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Overgrown hedges and trees ○ The speed of traffic through Golberdon and the lack of respect for the flashing speed advisory sign. Would speed humps be effective? Cllr Skelton thanked the speed watch volunteers who regularly monitored traffic through the village. Data from the speed advisory sign had been obtained and identified. It was noted that the Community Network had a limited fund for additional highway works. 	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Housing developments. The council confirmed that preliminary enquiries were being made to look at the possibility of affordable housing for local people. The parish council were making enquiries about the availability of some land belonging to Cornwall Council. A public meeting would be held if the project progressed. If pursued, this project may take the form of a community led scheme (CLT). A question was asked as to other land available, and Cllr Skelton confirmed the land identified was the only area the parish council were currently pursuing. 	
6	Any matters to be taken back to the Parish Council for consideration. None.	
7	To close the Meeting. The Chairman thanked everyone for attending and Cllrs Moir and Trewin for serving the tea and biscuits and closed the 2022 Annual Parish Meeting at 8.00pm.
